Confirmation Ministry at St. Paul Lutheran is an important part of our overall ministry to middle school students. Through this 3-year program, students will learn about our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ by attending class sessions, developing relationships, serving one another, and exercising their faith in new and exciting ways.



Why Confirmation?

- We are baptized “in the Name of our God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.” The purpose of Confirmation is to teach students how to “live out” their baptism. We want to focus on the “What does this mean?” question as it applies to daily life.
- We want students to learn about and experience life in a local congregation. The “Body of Christ”, the church, being made up of believers gathers together for mutual support and encouragement, as well as pooling resources and gifts to be used in the work of the kingdom. Students will begin to see themselves as a larger and more distinct part of this fellowship.
- We desire Confirmation to be a “step” in the walk of faith-helping students transition from childhood into adulthood. This faith walk is truly a lifelong journey made up of stones that direct one’s path. Parents and students together can proceed through a time of intense change seeking and knowing God’s will and applying it to everyday life.

Confirmation Requirements

Worship

- Christian families should worship together and at minimum families should plan on attending worship services
 - 26 times per year Sept 1st- Aug 31st
 - 20 for 8th grade students Sept 1st through May 1st.
- Only in-person participation in a worship service will be counted for this requirement.
- **Recording worship attendance**
 - When attending St. Paul- please sign in the red friendship book
 - Only 1 worship service per week is able to be recorded (unless there is a special holiday/Lent)
 - When attending another church please turn in a bulletin from that church with YOUR NAME/DATE ON IT.
 - We encourage you to continue to be connected to YOUR church, but worship services from other locations will be accepted, but something must be turned in to the church drop box.

Class Attendance

- We want your child in class and participating! Each student will be allowed two unexcused absences per half year; two in the fall and two in the spring.
- If a student is absent for any reason the student and parent/guardian together should complete the scheduled confirmation workbook lesson that is assigned.
- All lessons need to be completed by the time of the end-of-year review in April.

Testing and My Faith Activity

- 3-4 written tests will take place during the year, the schedule can be found in the front of your binder- Bible and catechisms can be used on the test.
- 1 My Faith Activity will take place at each grade level
- End-of-year written final questions come from the previous written tests, so save your tests!
- Verbal exam questions come from questions in the back of your binder, these same questions are covered in weekly family time at home.
- If a student misses a test or fails a test, they are responsible to schedule a make-up time as soon as possible.
- Please speak with the Director of Youth Ministry if your child has a learning challenge and needs alternate testing options!

Small groups are encouraged to meet outside of church for activities together. Watch for information from their mentors. Confirmands are welcome and encouraged to participate in youth ministry activities at St Paul. This includes youth group on Sunday evenings, service projects, special events, and family events. This ministry does take commitment and involvement on behalf of the student and his/her parents.

Cancelations Due to Weather

If the Sheboygan Falls School District is closed for the day or cancels after-school activities due to weather, there will be no confirmation that day. Please use your best judgment when traveling. Failure to meet requirements

The Confirmation Program at St. Paul Lutheran is one that students choose to walk through, with parental guidance. The church urges students in the sixth, seventh, and eighth grades to attend. It is our belief that Worship and Confirmation can and will help shape and develop individuals in their faith walk. Because this program is a choice, there are some basic policies and guidelines students are expected to meet. Failure to comply with these guidelines may result in one of three options. 1. A meeting with the Pastor to determine eligibility for the Rite of Confirmation. 2. A repeat of the year of Confirmation. 3. Families may also choose a Christian educational approach to the Confirmation program rather than a preparation for the Rite of Confirmation.
